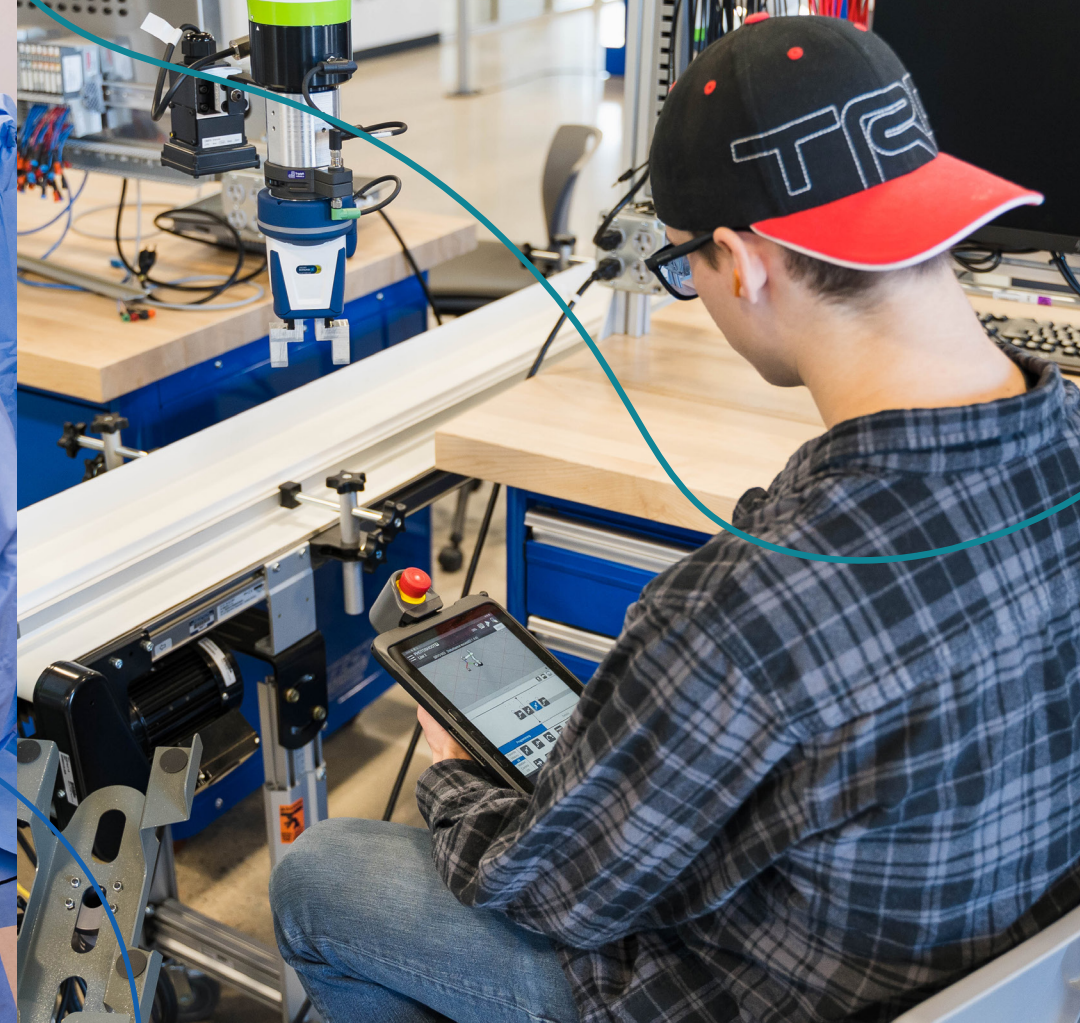

As NTC's most flexible option, Virtual College gives students the opportunity to begin classes and set due dates throughout the semester. Classes are taught by the same instructors who teach face-to-face courses, and provide quality learning experiences directed by the faculty, with a schedule directed by each student.

Computer Conferencing (ZOOM)

 Complete from anywhere

 Times are set by the instructor and meet regularly each week

Instructors teach in real-time and students participate in class discussions and work on projects with their peers via the web conferencing tool, Zoom. This type of environment is ideal for students who cannot physically be on campus, but prefer the community and structure of set learning times.

Online

 Complete from anywhere


Standard online classes give students the flexibility to complete their coursework online with the added structure of set due dates.

COMBINATION


Blended/Hybrid


Students complete some classes fully online at their pace, while there are still occasional set meeting dates and times from the instructor. In some cases the set days and times can be attended at a physical campus and/or via computer conferencing.

DUAL CREDIT

Dual credit allows high school students to earn college credits and save money on tuition while still in high school. Dual credit is an arrangement where you can earn both high school and college credit. Technical college courses are taught in the high school by college-certified high school instructors at no cost to the student or high school.

Benefits:

There are several benefits associated with completing dual credit classes, including: saving time and money by getting a free jump-start on college, getting a feel for the rigor of college classes while in a familiar learning environment and the ability to transfer credit to the college of your choice.

Dual credit courses transfer seamlessly into NTC programs. Courses are available in a variety of areas including Health, Agricultural Science, Technical & Trades, Business and Community Services.

Paying for College

IMPORTANT INFORMATION & NEXT STEPS:

To apply for federal student aid, such as federal grants, work-study, and loans; as well as financial aid through the State of Wisconsin, you need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Completing and submitting the FAFSA is free and easy to do!

The FAFSA is released prior to the year of attendance on October 1. File your FAFSA as close to October 1 as possible to improve your chances of qualifying for the most financial aid.

STEP 1

Go to studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch to create an FSA ID. The FSA ID will act as your electronic signature. If you need to include parent information on your FAFSA at least one parent will also need a FSA ID.

STEP 2

Go to studentaid.gov to apply for financial aid. Submit your FAFSA including NTC's school code 005387.

What you will need:

- Social security number
- Driver's license number
- Alien Registration Number (if you are not a U.S. citizen)
- Records of untaxed income, such as child support received and interest income
- Tax information from two years prior to the academic year. For example, if you are looking to attend college in Fall 2023, you would file the FAFSA using taxes from 2021
- Information on cash; savings and checking account balances and investments

The FAFSA form for the 2024-2025 school year will be released in December 2023 (two months after the usual October 1 release date).

STEP 3

The Financial Aid Office will email you after receiving your processed FAFSA.

Check your NTC student email account for additional information about financial aid which may include:

- Request for additional documents needed to fully process your FAFSA (referred to as verification)
- Notification of a financial aid offer
- Book voucher eligibility
- Work-study

Please note: In order to be offered financial aid, students must be accepted into an eligible program and enrolled in classes. Most correspondence from the Financial Aid Office will be made via email, so we encourage you to check your NTC student email regularly.

DEPENDENT STUDENT VS. INDEPENDENT STUDENT

Students who are dependent for federal student aid purposes must supply parent information on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Students who are independent do not have to supply their parents' information.

NTC PROMISE

NTC Promise provides free college tuition for qualified local high school graduates in the NTC district. This opportunity helps high school seniors realize their dreams of attending college while reducing financial barriers and ensuring a skilled workforce for our communities.

Through the generosity of the NTC Foundation, businesses and individual donors, the cost of tuition and fees will be covered by donated funds after federal and state financial aid (excluding loans and work-study) and scholarships have been applied.

We will provide up to five consecutive semesters of tuition free attendance for qualified students (up to 15 credits per semester; does not include summer semester) who meet ongoing requirements.

Promise participants will receive individual guidance and support from a dedicated advisor as they navigate the eligibility requirements of their program.

SCHOLARSHIPS: APPLY FOR A SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarships can be applied for twice a year, in the fall and spring semesters. Any awards will be applied to the following semester.

Before applying, you should know:

- Many NTC Foundation scholarships are established with specific criteria, however ONE application works for ALL available scholarships
- NTC Foundation scholarships are NOT cash
- Awards; scholarships are deposited directly into student accounts at the beginning of the following semester
- Scholarship awards may be taken into account on your next year's Federal Financial Aid application

(If your books and tuition are fully covered by another entity such as dislocated worker or veteran's benefits, these scholarships may not be helpful to you)

WORK STUDY: FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid helps you and your family pay for your education. Some aid needs to be paid back, while some is considered gift-aid (including grants and scholarships) and does not need to be repaid if satisfactory academic progress is being made.

The amount of financial aid you are eligible for depends on a number of factors, such as your family's expected contribution, if you are a veteran and other variables.

The work-study program provides part-time jobs for eligible students with financial need, allowing them to earn money to help pay educational expenses. Eligibility is determined by completing the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

VETERANS AFFAIRS (VA) AND MILITARY BENEFITS

Veterans, service members and their eligible dependents may qualify for VA and military benefits. Benefits could potentially cover the cost of tuition and/or offset other costs associated with your education.

STEP 2: SUBMIT ONE OF THE FOLLOWING

If you are interested in transferring credit from a different college, please submit your official transcripts to NTC in a sealed envelope from your previous school
- ACT/Accuplacer/Other test scores

WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT?

- What dining options are there?
- Where is the best place to study on campus?
- What job opportunities do you offer on campus?
- Are there leadership opportunities on your campus?
- Will you help me find a job after graduation?
- What is the career placement like for students that graduate from here?
- Is there academic support or tutoring available?
- What is the application process to go to school here?
- What types of student financial aid do you offer?
- What is it like being a first-year student here?
- What is a typical day like for a student here?
- What do students do when they're not in class?
- What do students do on the weekends?
- What are some typical on-campus jobs?
- Are there resources on campus to help with resumes and preparing for jobs?

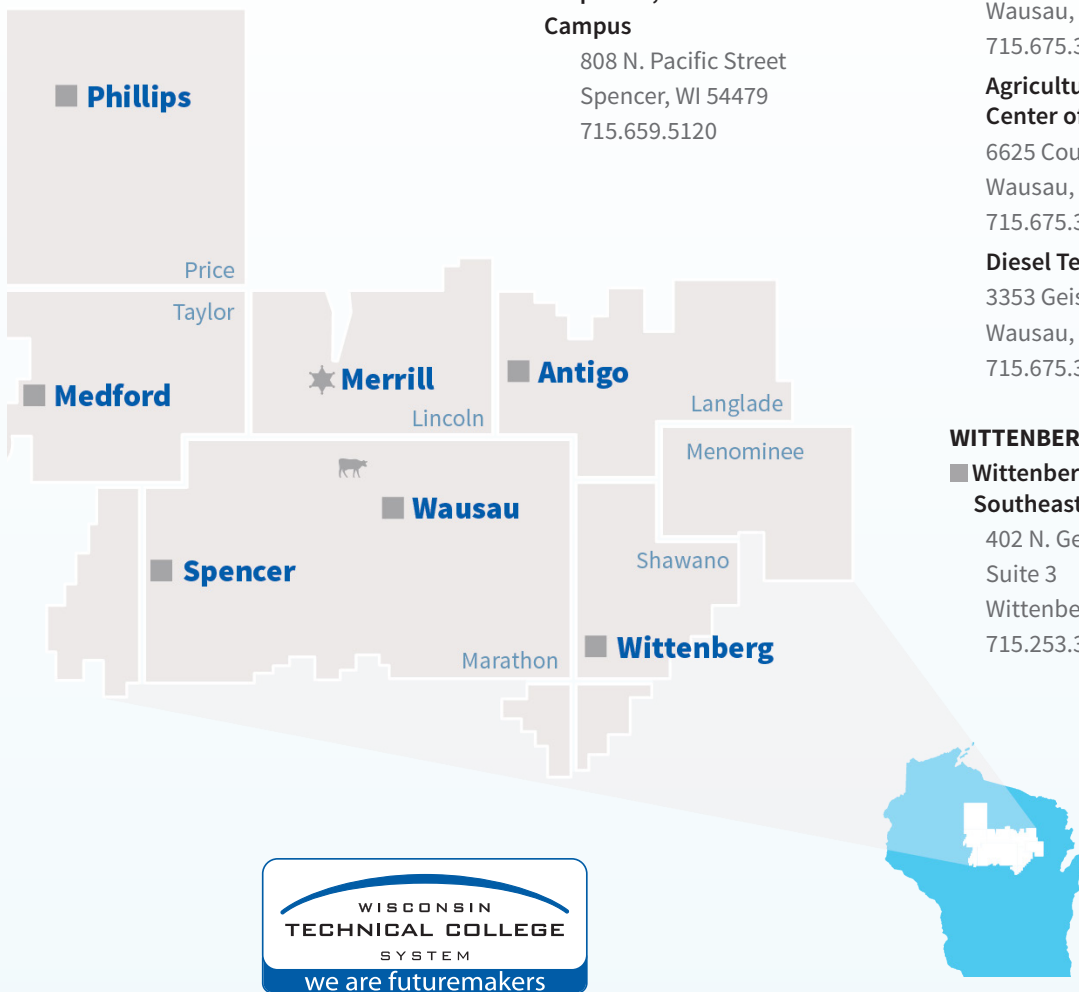
